# 6. Question and Answer Session

## 6.1 Village SPiD

JH said to date the newly installed SPiD had lasted 34 days on one charge of the battery. The speed parameters have now been adjusted from 25 to 50mph. The data logging software is now in place, but this could have an adverse effect on the battery life, however, in time it will allow the parish council the opportunity to build up a picture of traffic flow and speed in the village; particularly if its location is changed.

It was noted that there is no plate on Slaidburn Road to enable the SPiD to be located there. Once the data logging information becomes available it will be published on the village website; it was also suggested that a notice be put on the village noticeboards and is sent out via the school that the new SPiD is collected and recording data and information relating to traffic movement through the village.

Action: To look at installing a plate on a lamppost on Slaidburn Road to enable the SPiD to be located there.
